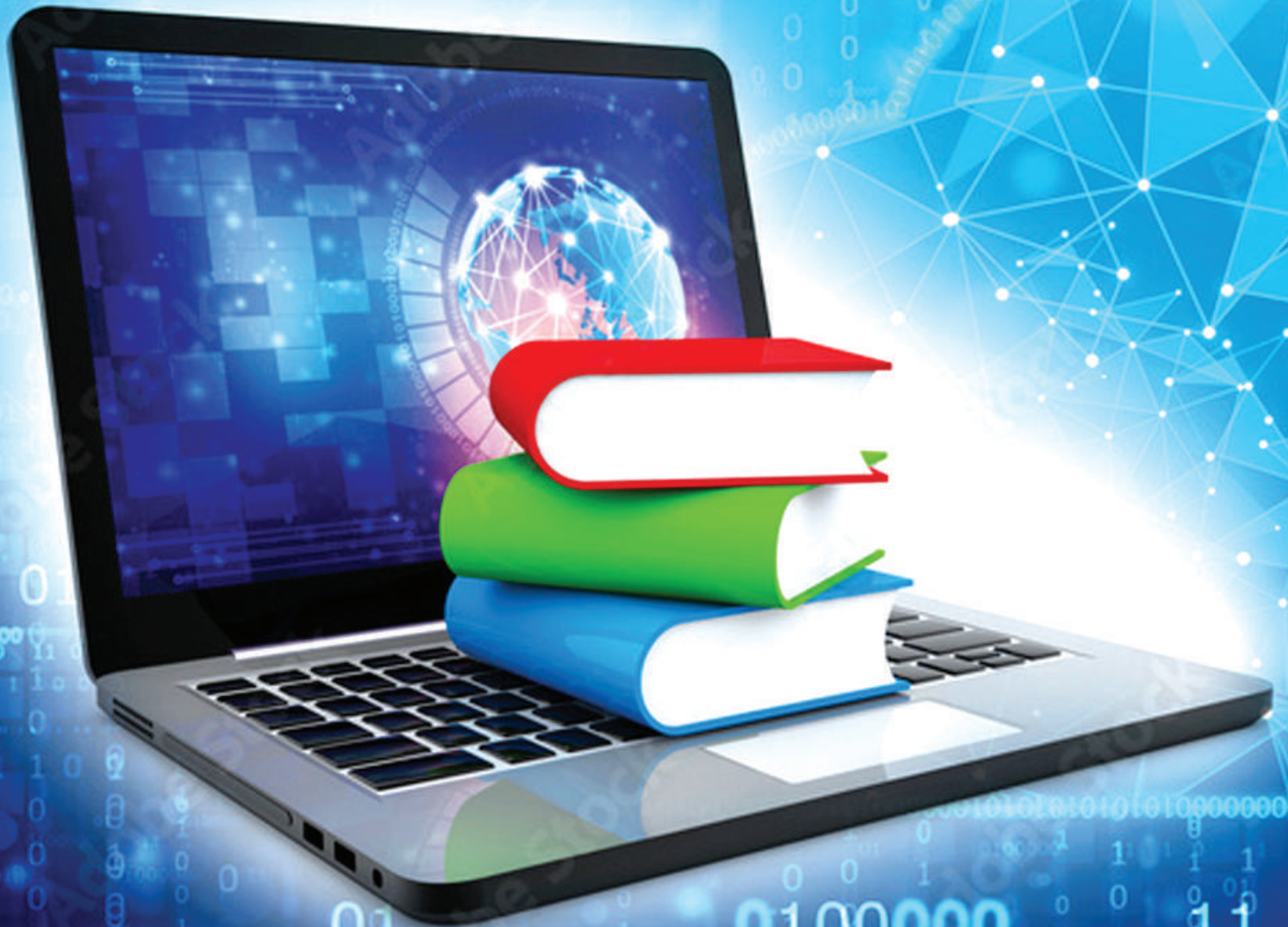

I have also placed a strong emphasis on the historical aspect since in my opinion it is critical to comprehend the origins of the subject, its components, and the reasons behind some current phenomena.

It is my intention that the book's content will provide readers with enough background information to grasp the subject matter, and that they will consult the references for more information and examples on the topics that most interest them.
